General meaning of the passage helps you decide here.

2. F

We read '...nobody will take me seriously if my English pronunciation is anything short of excellent.'

3. D

We read 'Would it be impolite of me to correct them?'

4. B

We read 'Do you have any ideas about how to make listening less difficult?'

5. G

We read '...the college I am studying in at present is full of people from my own country.'

6. D

We read '... the possibility of touching their grey-suede skin or even having a swim with a dolphin is a reward that encourages children like Jamie to respond to their teachers...'

7. D

We read 'The sessions start with the teacher encouraging the child to motion 'hello' to a dolphin, which responds with a shake of its head or fin.'

8. B

We read 'When a swimmer slides into water alongside a dolphin they can actually feel their skin tingling as the dolphin scans them with sonar.'

9. B

We read 'Scientists have discovered that dolphins 'talk' to each other, through a form of whistling.'

‘less’ in comparison with the previously mentioned.

The construction ‘such ...as’ is required here.

37. C

Participle I is used here as an adjective.

38. A

Participle II is required here.

39. B

‘to grow out of’ means ‘возникать из чего-то’.

40. A

Here we have a pattern – *other + plural noun*.

41. C

Present Simple Tense is required here.

42. D

‘lasting’ here means ‘продолжительный, устойчивый’
